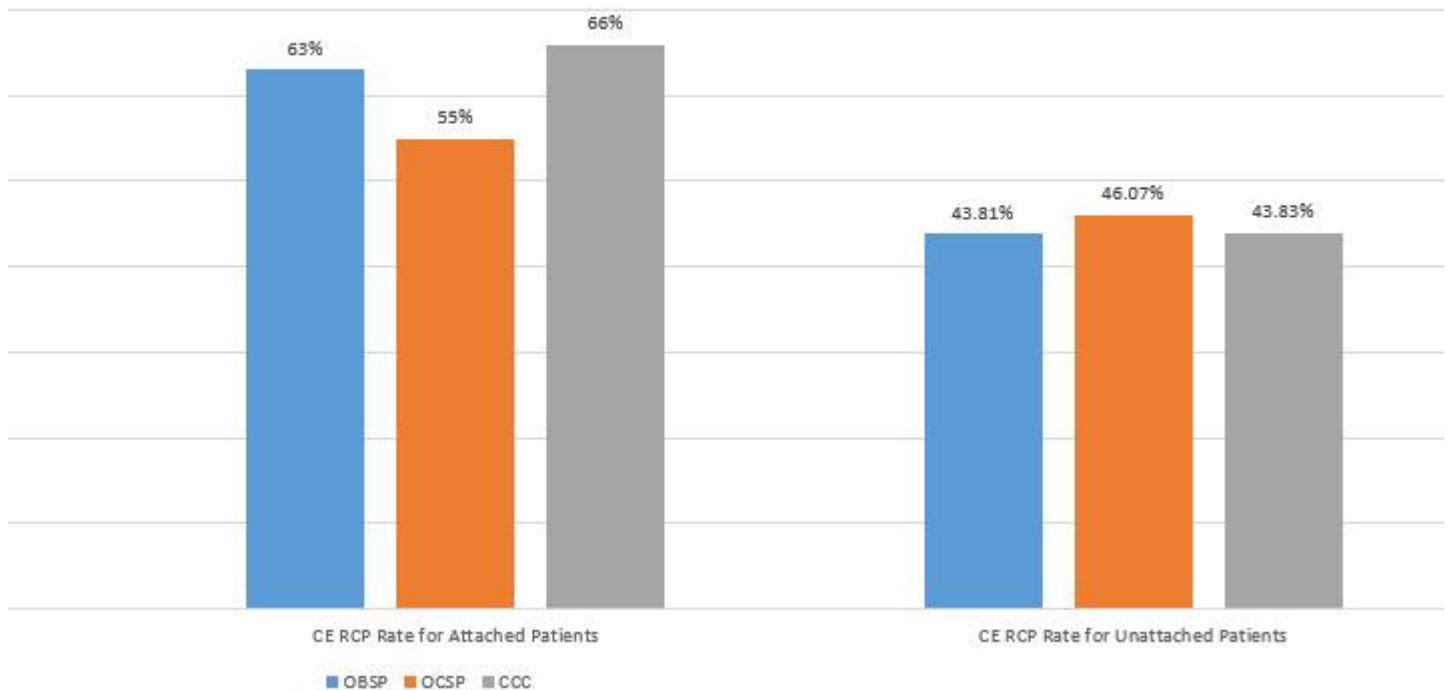

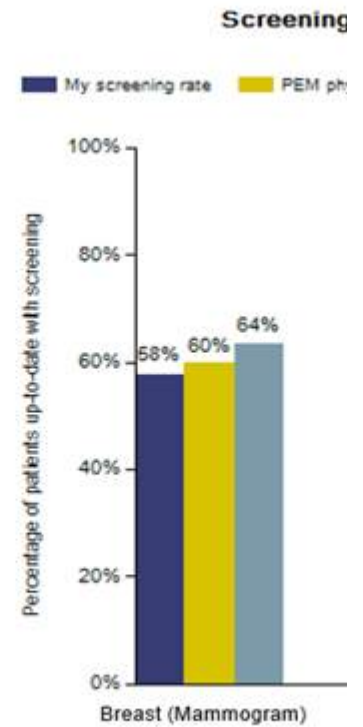

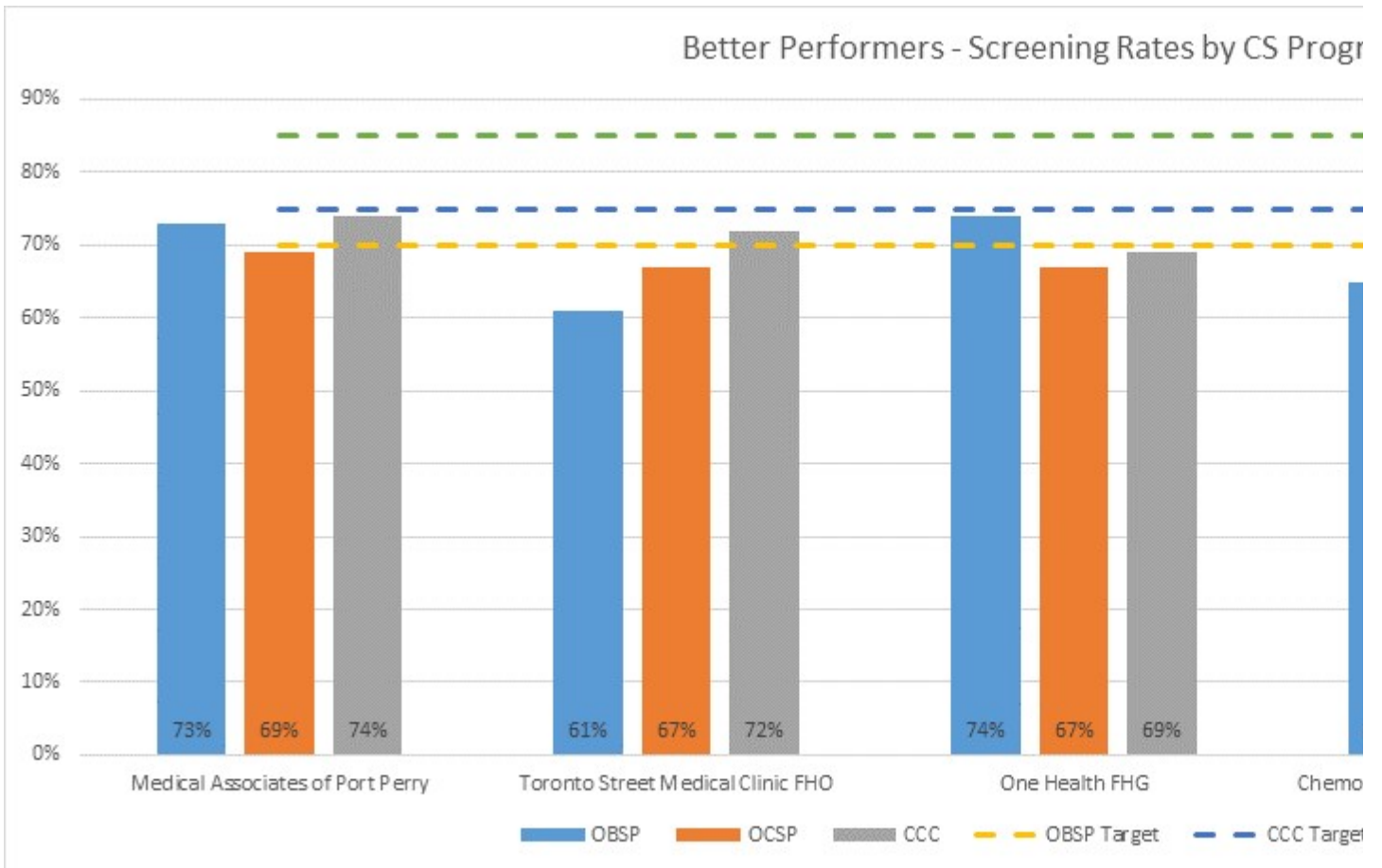
- The Screening Activity Report (SAR) and Physician-Linked Correspondence are valuable tools to support cancer screening within your practice.
 - The SAR supports viewing the screening status (complete/due/overdue) of your eligible patients. You can appoint a delegate (i.e., nurse, administrative/clerical) staff from your primary care team to access your SAR.

 - The Physician-Linked Correspondence generates cancer screening letters that sent out on your behalf by the Ontario Breast Screening Program, inviting and reminding enrolled patients to get screened. Studies show that when patients are encouraged by their physician, they are significantly more likely to complete their cancer screening.
