Cervical Cancer Awareness Month Highlights:

• January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month. Cervical Cancer is almost 100% preventable with screening and early treatment.



Meet Dr. Nathan Roth – Regional Colposcopy/Cervical Screening Lead: Dr. Roth is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Toronto and has a background in law, having completed a Masters of Law at Osgoode Hall. He holds a Black Belt in Lean Six Sigma from McGill University and has been on Faculty at New York University-Lagone and Bellevue Hospitals.

He brings a wealth of experience and process-driven results to his roles, having previously served as the Medical Director of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Scarborough Hospital. Dr. Roth played an important role as a Medical Advisor for the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, where he served as a reviewer, coach, mediator and Medical Lead in the development of the Quality Assurance Program.

In addition to his local contributions, Dr. Roth is currently the Regional Colposcopy and Cervical Screening Lead for the Central East Regional Cancer Program and serves as the Chair of a Section of the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, reflecting his dedication to women's health.



- **Reminder:** The attached **Cervical Screening Medical Directive Template** can be used by Primary Care Providers. There is no requirement or obligation to use this template, rather it is being shared with you as a tool to help improve your cervical screening rates through delegation to other providers on your team (i.e., RNs, RPNs, Midwives, etc.). The document is being released in Word format so you may tailor to suit your needs.
- Definition of Immunocompromised with respect to cervical screening:

People who are immunocompromised who are or ever have been sexually active and fall into one of the following groups should continue to be screened starting at age 21:

- People who are living with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV)/acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), regardless of viral load
- Transplant recipients (solid organ or allogeneic stem cell transplants)
- People requiring treatment (either continuously or at frequent intervals) with medications that cause immune suppression for three years or more
- People who are living with systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE), regardless of whether they are receiving immunosuppressant treatment
- o People with congenital (primary) immunodeficiency
- People who are living with renal failure and require dialysis


