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

- When to refer to an Out-of-Hospital Premises (OHP) vs Hospital
 - Exclusionary Criteria for OHP:

- BMI greater than 40
- asthma or COPD with admission to hospital in the last 12 months
- any diagnosis of congestive heart failure, ever
- any chest pain currently using nitroglycerin
- concerns with unaided ambulation, dressing, stretcher transfer
- renal dialysis

• ColonCancerCheck (CCC) Attachments: The Ontario Health (Cancer Care Ontario) maintains a list of primary care providers (PCPs) who have signed up to take on unattached patients requiring follow-up after an abnormal fecal immunochemical test (FIT) result,

or unattached patients who are at an increased risk of colorectal cancer requiring a screening colonoscopy. Both primary care physicians and nurse practitioners can support the attachment process. PCPs who are interested in attaching new patients to their

primary care practice are asked to sign and return the <u>attached form</u> to Ontario Health (Cancer Care Ontario). Patient Enrollment Model (PEM) physicians who accept a new patient referred from Cancer Care Ontario to their practice,

can claim the Q043A New Patient Fee Abnormal/Increased Risk Colorectal Cancer (CRC). The fee that can be claimed is \$150 to \$230 depending on the age of the patient. For more information about OHIP billing codes, please refer to the Ministry of Health.

• FIT+ patients in Urgent Care: Average Risk patients, without a Primary Care Provider (unattached), can call Health Connect Ontario at 811 to request that a FIT kit be mailed to their home.

After completing the test, if a patient receives an abnormal FIT result, the appropriate follow-up is to receive a colonoscopy, which requires a referring physician.

As these patients are without a Primary Care Provider and received the FIT kit without an ordering physician, they often seek referral support at an Urgent Care or Walk-In Clinic.

If a patient visits urgent care or a walk-in clinic with this request, it would be very helpful to the patient if the urgent care provider is able to support this request.

Many providers are hesitant because they believe the responsibility for the referral is that of the ordering physician of the FIT, but for these unattached patients, Health Connect Ontario was the point of entry. If you are a Primary Care Provider and interested in enrolling patients with abnormal FIT results, please submit the following form:

Colorectal cancer screening for uninsured patients: Colorectal cancer screening is important for everyone. We
understand that there can be challenges for those that that may not have a valid OHIP card.
 Please note that uninsured individuals (not eligible for ColonCancerCheck) can receive FIT testing through
Dynacare for \$59.00.
