Upcoming Cervical Screening Competency Trainings: In preparation of the upcoming HPV implementation go-live, the Central East Regional Cancer Program is assessing feasibility in arranging additional HPV and Pap Competency Workshops in mid to late February 2025 (prior to go-live). The intent of these workshops is to expand the number of healthcare providers that are trained to provide this valuable cancer screening to those that are eligible. The Central East Regional Cancer Program (CE-RCP) has earned two prestigious recognitions at the 17th Annual Cancer Quality Council of Ontario Quality and Innovation Awards, co-sponsored by the Cancer Quality Council of Ontario and Canadian Cancer Society.

The team was awarded the 2024 Indigenous Health Award for their Indigenous Cultural Safety Training, as well as an Honourable Mention in the Equity Award category for the EmpowerHer Breast and Cervical Health Seminar.

Lakeridge Health Breast Imaging Requisition Process:

After careful consideration and thorough discussions, the Lakeridge Health breast center will be implementing a standardized process for breast imaging requisitions to ensure consistency across all Lakeridge Health sites.

Lakeridge Health will maintain the current process for initial recalls and bookings managed by our clerical teams. However, any appointments falling outside this initial recall window will require a requisition from the ordering provider.

To enhance communication, this requirement will be included in the radiologist's report.

The proposed timeline for implementation is as follows:

- 1. Effective **February 1, 2025**, we will begin requiring requisitions.
- Full compliance with this standardized process, including six-month follow-ups, will take effect on August 1, 2025.

This approach will facilitate clearer communication between referring providers and our teams while reducing last-minute appointment cancellations for patients. This process offers a proactive solution to streamline workflows and enhance patient care.



• Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) is pleased to announce the recruitment of two thoracic surgeons, Dr. Daniel Sisson, MD, FRCSC and Dr. Shannon Trainor, MD, FRCSC. With the support of their two Nurse Navigators.

Dr. Sisson and Dr. Trainor—who are based out of Lakeridge Health Oshawa—will support local patients and primary care providers by running a weekly on-site thoracic surgery clinic at NHH.

While surgical procedures will continue to be provided out of Lakeridge Health, patients of this new clinic can receive pre-operative, post-operative and follow-up treatment, bringing a significant portion of their care close to home.

OH-CCO Updates:

- Physician-Linked Correspondence: Physician-linked correspondence is an effective way to motivate eligible patients to get screened for cancer. To register, please see the attached document.
- Soft Tissue Sarcoma Diagnosis Pathway for the standardized diagnosis of suspected cases of adult soft tissue sarcoma in Ontario.

In 2016, the pathway was originally developed collaboratively by a Working Group of regional clinical representatives, through an evidence-based approach facilitated by Cancer Care Ontario (now a part of Ontario Health)

and the Sarcoma Services Steering Committee. This pathway has now been reviewed and updated to ensure its current clinical relevance. The purpose of the pathway is to provide guidance to health care providers on the appropriate

referral of suspected cases of soft tissue sarcoma across Ontario. The pathway provides an overview of the presentation and clinical work-up of cancer diagnosis that an individual in the Ontario cancer system may receive.

Use of this Pathway across the province will ensure patients with suspected cases of soft tissue sarcoma have timely access to high quality care provided by a multidisciplinary sarcoma team, tailored to their individual needs.
