



Cervical cancer is almost 100% preventable!

Regular cervical screening tests every 5 years*
and the HPV vaccination can help prevent
cervical cancer.

HPV is a virus that can cause cervical cancer

- For men and women between 9-45 years of age.
- Ontario introduced school-based HPV vaccination program in the 2007-2008 school year for grade 7 and 8 students.
- Cervical cancer is the 3rd most common cancer in Canadian women 20-40 years of age, impacting 1,400 women each year.
- Without immunization, three out of four sexually active Canadians will be infected with HPV at some point in their lives.

***Some people may need to get screened more often based on their medical or screening history. Talk to your Primary Care Provider to find out more about cervical screening test and HPV vaccines.**
